7	Municipal Utilities Authority is the place of said

11	MS. NICARETTA: Dr. Buza. Mr. Grand?
12	MR. GRAND: Here.
13	MS. NICARETTA: Mr. Kendzulak?

16	CHAIRMAN KINSELLA: Here.

18	CHAIRMAN KINSELLA: Please rise for
19	the pledge of allegiance.
20	Thank you. All right. Move to
21	applications. There being none, and now we'll go to
22	our public rate hearing.
23	Mike, all yours.
24	
25	MR. CRAGIN: The proposed rate

- 1 increases the user fee from \$636 to -- from \$624 to
- 2 \$636. It's a \$3.00 a quarter increase. The base
- 3 fee would increase from \$162 to \$165 less than a
- 4 \$1.00 a quarter.
- 5 The proposed revenue would increase,
- 6 total revenue for the Authority by about \$200,000.
- 7 This would help cover the additional cost in the
- 8 2018 budget, which among the few are the 2017 NJEIT,
- 9 which is about \$76,000. And the capital projects
- that are included in there for \$155,000.
- MR. KENDZULAK: What is the rate
- 12 being increased, from what?
- MR. CRAGIN: From \$624 to \$636.
- MR. KENDZULAK: Okay.
- MR. WATTS: Those rates are
- supportive of the budget that was already approved
- 17 by the state.
- 18 MR. KENDZULAK: Correct. That's
- 19 actually the second resolution.
- 20 CHAIRMAN KINSELLA: Yes. Can you
- 21 talk about the connection fee, Mike?
- MR. CRAGIN: Connection fees, we are
- 23 budgeting \$50,000. The fee was calculated in
- 24 accordance with the regulations. And in the budget,
- we had budgeted it for about \$50,000 in 2018.

- 1 MR. KENDZULAK: It's going to \$4,039
- 2 as compared to the current fee of?
- 3 MR. CRAGIN: I don't have that
- 4 written down.
- 5 MR. LaFERLA: \$3,962 -- or excuse me,
- 6 \$3,961.
- 7 MR. KENDZULAK: And this is all based
- 8 on law, essentially?
- 9 MR. CRAGIN: Correct. It's basically
- 10 based on the infrastructure of the entire Authority.
- 11 What you've paid in since inception, and then
- basically every person who comes in after that pays
- 13 their fair share of that.
- 14 CHAIRMAN KINSELLA: Anything else
- 15 from anyone?
- MR. WATTS: The record should reflect
- there are no members of the public here.
- 18 CHAIRMAN KINSELLA: Any other
- 19 comments Mike, from you?
- MR. CRAGIN: No.
- 21 CHAIRMAN KINSELLA: That's it,

Mr. Madden – Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. asked me to do a presentation on the metering and I have that set up.

Mr. Kinsella – Let's do that first.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Why don't you do the updates to your report first.

Mr. Madden – Commerce Street, they did what they call their pre – cleaning of the line, which is the heavy cleaning they do before they line the pipe. When they did that they found some excessive leaks and they're concerned about the liner adhering and working so they want to go in and grout those joints that are leaking. There are five of them that they thought needed grouting. They gave me a proposal originally to do it, an extra \$4,500.00 but I'm asking them to adjust that because we require them to use a pre – liner, which is a sleeve that would go in ahead of the liner, and they want to do the grouting instead of the pre – liner in two of those sections so I asked them to give me a credit for that. They were supposed to get that to me today but they did not so I'm going to follow up with that so we would be looking at an additional cost of a couple of grand to do the grouting but

that would really solve the problem that it could migrate down the pipe and turn into another weak point somewhere. It will help seal that up.

Mr. Kinsella - Do we have photo documentation of this?

Mr. Madden - Yes, I can provide that.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - When are they supposed to do the work?

Mr. Madden - They're supposed to do it next week.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – So, you need some type of authorization?

Mr. Madden – Yes.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - Yes, lets' get it done.

Mr. Madden – I talked to the contractor for the school, they're mobilizing on the first week of January. He told me it shouldn't take more than five or six days for them to do their actual work.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – All I have to say is I don't know where that plays out in the schedule...

Mr. Madden – They're ahead of schedule.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - ...because if they're pushing the envelope, once they fall behind the letters have to start flying.

Mr. Madden – They've had some issues with their submittals being rejected and they had to resubmit so they lost some time there and they want to get that resolved. The last thing, we had the review for Raritan Town Square. They're requesting additional flow from the Authority to construct low income housing, if you recall the letter that came in last month? They want to transfer nine EDUs from the Costco site across the street to the Raritan Town Square site. In addition to that, they needed additional EDUs; they calculated twenty - seven, when I did it, they needed ninety. You don't allow transferring of capacity from lots like that and they're basing their flows on measured flow which is unsubstantiated. Plus, you don't have the capacity they need.

(Mr. Madden showed his presentation)

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - Is that the last slide you have?

Mr. Madden – Yes.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Here's the question I have, is there something that we would want to see and say "lets focus on certain things"? I know we were talking about looking at anything along a waterway, a creek or something like that; to walk those lines and make sure there's no obvious manhole lids that blew off or any stuff like that. Then, is there something that would be the next thing we would do, like TV an area that might be suspect; is that a plan that you could develop?

Mr. Madden – I think we should do that; there's nothing that beats going out in a rain storm and looking at manholes and saying "this manhole, we have a lot of flow in here, it's not normally this high" or "this one isn't so bad". You know, if one is down stream and the next one upstream is bad, you can say "something is

going on between here". That kind of thing would be helpful. That way you can establish a pattern and a plan with Mr. LaFerla.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – I guess we're a little too early for smoke testing?

Mr. Madden – No, we're not at that point yet. The smoke testing won't pick up sump pumps.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – That's not what we're really looking for.

Mr. Madden – Well, that is part of it.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – We're looking for something big though.

Mr. Madden – It could be a lot of little things here too is what I'm trying to say. You get that big one; when that one recedes, you're still getting a lot of flow into the pipe.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Personally, I'd like to see what the next part of the plan of attack is. These are the lines we want to look at, whether we walk them when they're wet and then let's look to focus on TV inspecting these lines here.

Mr. Madden – Well, we want to wait to get all the data, and really go through it and do a more thorough analysis of it. We have to get all of the records from Hach; their installation and calibration and things like that; we want to eliminate any extraneous things that could throw our data off.

Mr. LaFerla – You said there were three storms that you measured?

Mr. Madden - Yes. three or four.

Mr. LaFerla – How far apart where the rain storms?

Mr. Madden - I'm not sure.

Mr. LaFerla – What I'm saying; you said it went up drastically all of a sudden but then it took a long time to get back down. If it's taking a long time to come back down, and it's still coming down and then you get more rain, it pops back up but it could pop back up because the sump pumps are still running and more water is running in so the sump pumps have to run more often.

Mr. Madden – That's what I'm saying, you're seeing stuff like that. I think there's also some kind of cross connection or something like that too. This is just a brief history of what has happened so far but like I said, I think the next step will be to start looking upstream along the interceptor because I think we're getting sudden surges within the first hour or so.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Where do we stand with the clarifier?

Mr. LaFerla – Mr. Tilvawala from DEP called to see the status.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - So, we requested proposals and we need to evaluate the proposal, the dollar value and that's got to be submitted to DEP and then that should be it?

Mr. Madden – Yes, I submitted a proposal yesterday. They require in writing to put in for full time inspection. I put it in because I know that they want to see it but in reality, I know we probably won't need it. I don't know if they'll entertain that.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Is that a conversation that needs to be had with the fellow from DEP? Is that a conversation that you can have with the fellow from DEP?

Mr. Madden - I can have it yes.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - Then I would go ahead and have it.

7. Discussion:

a) Dielectric Matting

Mr. Kinsella - If this was in the Contract, they were supposed to supply mats as part of the job?

Mr. LaFerla – It's in the Contract but as an overall "you have to follow the regulations for the electric". Then you have to pick out what specifically needs to be followed for that job. For Dielectric Mats, you need 5kv for Dielectric Mats but

we only have 480, therefore we are not required by the Contract to have them supplied. The people that are requiring the mats are from the JIF insurance. That's because they are going to require anything to make anything safer. Mr. Sciss got the mats, the cost was \$252.20.

Mr. Kinsella – How many mats did we have to get?

Mr. LaFerla – Just one section because we already had some. As soon as we received the recommendation from the insurance company I had Mr. Sciss order the mat.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – So, we're okay with the JIF now? And it cost us \$250.00?

Mr. LaFerla – Yes, \$252.20.
