Mr. Madden – The SCADA contractor started this week; they came in and toured the plant and all of the pump stations and they are collecting data that they need to get moving. We got a hold of the guy from Asphalt Paving; I think he was here this morning to take a look. He is going to get back to us with technical details of what we need and an estimated cost.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Is that State Contract?

Mr. Tully - I'm not sure.

Mr. Madden – I'm not either. It would be worth looking at.

Mr. Mangin – Asphalt used to be County.

Mr. Tully – Asphalt Paving Systems is one of two companies that do the reclamation process, but I don't know about State Contract.

Mr. Madden – I think the last price we saw was close to one hundred fifty a ton with overlay. I think I measured just the driveway portions, not the parking lots; something like seven thousand square yards or something like

that. We will get the final numbers together; we are working on that right now. We discussed the sludge holding tank, which is under way. We will have a kick-off meeting once all of the contracts are signed. JEV, was the low bidder, they know the process and they have worked here before and know all the details, so I don't expect any problem. We are still working on the generator replacement project specs for bidding. We are still looking for some details on the electrical system here. We are gathering pieces as we go here. I think we are almost there though. There is flow monitoring going on, the crews are out doing CCTV inspections. They did find one site over in Sun Ridge, where there is a partial collapsed pipe, so we have to figure out what is going on there. Coincidentally, there is a tile drain installed over the top of it. I don't know when that went in.

Mr. Hazard - What is a tile drain?

Mr. Madden – It basically sits in the grass, and it is a low point.

Mr. Tully – A yard drain.

Mr. Madden – Yes. We don't think it is connected, I'm hoping it is not connected but it may have done damage to the pipe when they put it in, I don't know.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. - I almost hope it is.

Mr. Madden – We will find out but there is definitely a belly in the pipe. The contractor is doing some warranty repair on the clarifier.
