Mr. Madden – We are currently out to bid for the sludge holding tank #1 replacement. It was advertised early last week, and we have had several people pick up the plans and specs. That is moving along. We are expecting to have the bid opening on June 9th. Hopefully, there won't be any issues and we can issue a Contract. We have been monitoring flows; there have been a few rain storms. Pump Station #1 is what we keep an eye on. That is kind of following suit with the rainstorms we have been having; nothing crazy out of left field there. We did update the I & I Report and basically what we found was that feeder leg from Johanna is really not an issue as

far as I & I goes. The stuff that is upstream of that is a bigger problem, so we moved the meters downstream to get the different legs coming so we can connect the dots here and finding out stuff. In the interim, the field crews have been out, and they are doing some CCTV inspections and they found something today that could be a potential issue. I want to say it was on Almond Drive in Sun Ridge. They found a drainage grate in the lawn and there is a problem with a sag in our line right there. We don't know if it was damaged when they put this drain in. We can't even see if it is connected.

Mr. Tully – Or if it is connected to the sewer system.

Mr. Madden – That would be the big number we are looking for; that is a pretty big drainage area. We are definitely going to look at that a little closer.

Mr. Tully – Were there any sleeve repairs in the last month?

Mr. Madden – They have a few of them that they are supposed to put in, but I don't think they have done them yet. They did have an outside contractor come in and they repaired a couple of manholes and sealed up some things. The plan is, we have a list of these things, and we will pick them off when we either have money or put a bunch of them out to bid or do as many as we can in house. That is the game plan and see if we can see some reduction in the numbers. I think unless we find a big problem area, it is just a bunch of little things to tighten up. We did finish the collection system O & M Manual that the EPA required. They accepted it and it will help maintain the system. We have added forms to fill out and it will all get entered into the GIS system. I reached out to the paving company that does the reclamation. I talked to the representative from Peckham Industries, and they are interested.

Mr. Tully – The nice thing with that is we have four jobs going on in the Township over the next six months where there is going to be a reclamation project. Depending on who gets it, if you want to get a bid from both, then maybe they will be able to stage it while they are here doing one of our jobs, so they don't have to do the mobilization twice.

Mr. Madden - That would be ideal.

Mr. Tully – I'll get you the information for Asphalt Paving Systems and you can have them come in and look at it too. I will get you the exact contact because they are doing the one we are doing now.

Mr. Madden – Were they awarded the Contract?

Mr. Tully – Yes. They are working with Top Line on Rittenhouse Circle.

Mr. Madden – Last on the list is the generator. We have some missing data that we are still trying to decipher. There are some drawings

missing and things like that. We kind of know where it is, we just have to sit down with the guys down below.

Mr. Tully – Were you guys able to figure out the As-Built conditions when they did the motor control center?

Mr. Madden – There are some breakers down there but some of them aren't being used. We have to see what is connected there. We want to make sure we are not undersized or oversized. Junction Road, that tie in was completed this month.

Mr. Tully – Since you are talking; the I & I Study? We kind of talked about it. Is there anything you want to add?

Mr. Madden – That is really what it was. I know Mr. Kendzulak was asking about it last month so we wanted to update it.

Mr. Tully – I know Mr. Frank is not here the Administrative and Operations report, from what I know, it looked okay.

Ms. Nicaretta – Number nine, the Loss Control Report, ever since Mr. Sciss became maintenance supervisor, I think except for the very first one, we have never had any New Suggestions for Improvement, whereas before him, we used to.

Mr. Tully - That is pretty good. I did speak with Mr. Sciss today, he wanted to let me know that there was an auto accident on Voorhees Corner Road that took out the pole and the power to Sun Ridge Pump Station #1, on Edgewood Terrace. Basically, yanked all the wires out of the pump station on a Sunday. Mr. Sciss and the other guys came in right away, called our supplier who Mr. Sciss has a good relationship with, they went in Sunday night to their facility and got Mr. Sciss what he needed to get it all up and running and they got everything strung and ready to go in the pump station ready to go overnight into Monday. They called our electrical inspector at the Township to do a quick inspection so JCP&L would turn the power back on. Within a sixteen- or seventeen-hour period, they had rewired the entire supply from the pole to the pump station because of the electrician we have working down there. Just so everyone knows, those guys, worked diligently to get it back online because that is a critical pump station at that point in the system. Those guys need some kind of recognition that they did a great job. I think I'm going to send Mr. Sciss an email tomorrow and let him know to let his crew know that we appreciate it and I'll copy Mr. Frank on it so he knows too.
